The Western Nebraska Home Educators Network is a voluntary network that exists to support homeschooling families in Western Nebraska and Eastern Wyoming with educational opportunities and support group activities that enhance their homeschool experience.

We are an "inclusive" homeschool network. We welcome all families regardless of their religious beliefs, political views, education or parenting philosophies. We do not require our members to sign a statement of faith in order to participate.

We believe that it is the parent's right and responsibility to decide which activities and classes are appropriate for their child based on their personal family values and needs. We encourage members to focus on similarities and respect differences.

Our primary goal is to support, encourage and educate homeschooling families. We do this in two different and very distinct ways. First is our Support Group which focuses on the family! Our Support Group offers such things as field trips, special outings, campouts, activities and most importantly support for homeschooling families. Second is our Cooperative which focuses on our child's educational needs. Our Cooperative offers a variety of classes for all ages including classes which are difficult to teach at home such as Band, Choir, and Speech.

Our Cooperative is a wonderful opportunity for homeschooling families to come together, once a week, to share their talents, skills and knowledge with each other in order to supplement our children's education. The focus of the Cooperative is on our children's educational needs.

Fall and Spring Semesters are held on Mondays and usually run nine weeks from 9:00 am to noon. We offer classes for grades K-12 along with a nursery and preschool for families in need of these services.

The cost of classes at our Cooperative are kept to a minimum in order to make it feasible for anyone who is interested to attend. Classes are taught by homeschooling parents as a ministry to their fellow homeschooling families. At times, outside instructors may come in.

Support Group

Our Support Group's primary focus is to support and encourage homeschooling families through a variety of field trips, park days, special outings, campouts, activities and events.
